Tips for teaching All Too Well

"All Too Well" was the standout hit when Taylor Swift released "Red~ Taylor's version" in 2021. Teen Swifties will be so pleased to know that you only need 4 chords to play one of their favorite break-up anthems.

A word of warning for teachers who aren't familiar with this song- you probably want to teach the original (shorter) version of All Too Well. The famed 10-minute version includes a big curse word that you likely don't want to have students singing. If you teach adults, that's between you and your student.

That C chord at the end is only necessary if you want to have an "ending" at the end of the chorus. Alternatively, there are a couple more verses.
