Tips for teaching "Someone You Loved"

This one is pretty straight forward so once you've got the hang of the chords in root position jump straight to inversions. Encourage your student to experiment with different positions and decide what sounds best to their ears. Have fun!

Tips for teaching "Someone You Loved" Inversions

You'll notice that only the C & Am chords are inverted in this chart. That's very intentional here because it keeps the hand in the same neighborhood. I recommend keeping the right hand around or below middle C.
